10-year Plan to care for town Open Spaces

Future care of the open spaces maintained by the Town Council has been mapped out in a 10-year plan to keep the areas looking good. It will help councillors budget annually for work on sites ranging from Marsh Green in the south to Mowshurst and the Millennium Wood in the north. The areas include sports pitches, parks, playgrounds, allotments and the cemincluding etery, items ranging from trees, fences, and outdoor walls, surfaces, furniture, to paths, and play equipment.



External consultants have advised a programme of works averaging £42,000 a year over the decade, to keep the areas well maintained.

Be Prepared—for Winter

Wet and windy weather arriving in November was a reminder to be prepared for winter. Those who live in a flood-risk area need to think ahead, and Edenbridge has hosted training for Flood Wardens, who will gather and share information about water levels, improving communication and knowledge to help those responding to an emergency.

A small stock of sandbags is held locally, provided by Sevenoaks District Council for residents to collect if needed, and they will deliver more to town as required. The Town Council has topped up its salt bins, in case of ice and snow, and is ready to help Kent Highways keep the town centre pavements gritted if needed.

Policies take shape for Neighbourhood Plan

Results from two key surveys are helping shape local planning Edenbridge policies in the Neigh-Neighbourhood Plan bourhood Plan.

Local residents were asked to help the project team by sharing what their housing needs would be over the next few years. Nearly 1,000 households replied, and showed households need affordable housing, 28 households need open market housing. And 100 more said they or someone living with them was thinking of moving to alternative accommodation Edenbridge in five or more years. There was support for a development of affordable local housing, if there was a proven need for people with a genuine local connection to Edenbridge.

Replies to the local Business Survey showed key concerns were lack of suitable premises and the quality of broadband services holding back business expansion, also the appearance and function of the High Street, particularly the Leathermarket area.

Creating a Neighbourhood Plan containing local-level planning policies can help communities shape the way they develop in future. Local people are invited to join in and help create the future of the town, and can keep up to date with the news on Facebook or contact 01732 865368.
