4. FINANCE BUSINESS

4.1 Accounts and Annual Report

The Charity End of Year Accounts 2018/19 and the Annual Report were presented for approval. The Accounts had been audited by the Internal Auditor and were circulated with the Annual Report.

4.2 Review Investments

Trustees noted the amount invested with Scottish Widows, in a Bank Maturity Base Rate Tracker Account, was £16,227.11 as at 31 March 2019.

4.3 Edenbridge Primary School

Trustees noted the school had confirmed that the Year 1 outdoor learning area is now in use and they were looking forward to Cllr Todd joining them for the opening on the 3rd October. They had two projects for the coming year that would benefit from a donation from the Norman Foundation.

1. Year 6 are developing an outside area and have already prepared the grounds with an all weather surface, and the school would be grateful for help with purchasing furniture for that area.
2. The school is trying to develop a music room and needs some new musical instruments as many are very old and have seen better days.

Resolved: that the Norman Foundation would make a further donation of £1,000 this Financial year to be used towards one of the above projects.

Independent Examiner’s report to the Trustees of the Norman Foundation
I report on the accounts of the Norman Foundation for the year ending 31st March 2019, which are set on the accompanying pages.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner.

As the charity trustees, you are responsible for the Statutory duty of care under Section 1 (1) of the Trustees Act 2000, for the preparation of accounts and independent examination of accounts as contained in Part VI of the 1993 Act (as amended) and regulations made under that Act.
