As we look forward to the year ahead, we are excited to be handing out grants and CIL money to various organisations in Edenbridge and seeing how the money is making a positive impact within our community. Individuals and organisations were able to apply for a grant or contribution from the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) at the end of last year, towards projects benefitting the community.

The Budget and Precept for 2023-24 was prepared and recommended by the Finance Committee to the full Council at its December meeting, and has been published on the Council's website. Council is due to approve this at its January meeting. The Precept is the local proportion of your Council Tax that goes towards paying for the services provided by Edenbridge Town Council.

Agenda papers will be available on the Council website.




