BUDGET AND COUNCIL TAX 2023-24

For £3.50 a week we will continue to deliver important services and facilities in Edenbridge this year.

Our detailed budget for 2023-24, which was approved by the Full Council in January, can be viewed on our website, where you can also find an extensive list of the services Edenbridge Town Council provides: www.edenbridgetowncouncil.gov.uk/annual-budget-and-precept

This budget determines what contributions residents must make via their Council Tax towards our services, which we are proud to deliver to a high standard.

Based on a Council Tax Band D property, each household will see a 5% increase on last year. This means the average household will pay £180.43 a year for the services of Edenbridge Town Council compared to £171.84 in 2022-23. That's an increase of 17 pence per week.

This money will be collected via your Council Tax from Sevenoaks District Council. The Town Council's proportion is the smallest part of the total amount of Council Tax you pay, which also helps fund the services provided by the District Council and County Council,

as well as Kent Police and Fire & Rescue.

Polling Station!

The UK Government has introduced a requirement for voters to show **photo ID** when voting at a polling station at some elections. This new requirement will apply for the first time in England at the local elections for Edenbridge Town Council and Sevenoaks District Council on Thursday 4 May 2023.

REGISTER TO VOTE

The deadline to register to vote in the elections in England on 4 May 2023 is 11.59 pm on Monday 17 April. To register to vote online, you need just five minutes and your National Insurance number. Register at www.electoralcommission.org.uk
