# It's a win for Edenbridge's football pitches at the Rec

The Council has been presented with a wall plaque for achieving a 'good' standard for all five of the football pitches at the Recreation Ground, Lingfield Road following a recent *PitchPower* assessment. The Council is now eligible to apply for a 100% grant of £16,896 from the Football Foundation to help sustain the pitches at this level.

The Football Foundation's goal is to ensure grassroots football has

20,000 'good' quality pitches to enjoy by 2030. They can provide grants for 'good' pitches to maintain their quality standard, and to 'poor' or 'basic' pitches to help them make improvements. "This is great news for Edenbridge and for the many players that use the pitches," said Council Chairman Cllr Bob Todd, who recieved the plaque alongside Head Groundsman, Craig Open.
